

Safeguarding threshold document training

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Introduction

- > Developed by the NLSAB in response to findings from case audits and following consultation with partners, in September 2022.
- Aims to create consistency across organisations in North Lincolnshire in relation to what is being reported to the Safeguarding Adults Team.
- > This guidance is not a substitute for professional judgement it should be used as a framework for decision making and to support and aid your professional judgement.
- Concerns should not be looked at in isolation it is imperative that you look at the bigger picture!
- If, at the point of referral, there is insufficient information to apply the safeguarding thresholds, then further enquiries should be made to gather this information.

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SAFEGUARDING THRESHOLDS								
TYPE OF ABUSE: PHYSICAL	NON - REPORTABLE, NO HARM OR ABUSE, LOW RISK / NO IMPACT	REPORTABLE, SOME HARM OR RISK OF HARM, MEDIUM RISK	REPORTABLE, SIGNIFICANT HARM OR RISK OF HARM, HIGH RISK					
The act of causing physical harm to someone else. Can include, but not exhaustive: - Hitting - Spitting - Pushing- Restraint - Intentional or reddless injury including Female Genital Mutilation (FGM)	Lower level concern where threshold for a safe-guarding enquiry is unlikely to be met. Agencies should keep a written internal record of what happened and what action was taken (based on internal processes and procedures). Where there are a number of low - level concerns, consider whether the threshold is met for a safeguarding enquiry due to increased risk. - Isolated incident, simply resolved - Isolated incident, simply resolved - Isolated incident, simply resolved - No harm or a base intended - Appropriate moving and handling procedures not followed on one occasion-not resulting in harm - Robust recording - Risk assessments / action plans in place - Incident not caused by a Person in Position of Trust (PIPOT)	Incidents should be reported to the Safequaring Adults Feam within the council, where a decision whether to progress the concern to a S42 enquiry will be made. Examples: Linexplained minor marking or lesions, cuts or grip marks found on a number of accusions, or on a number of adults with care and support needs cared for by the same team / care in appropriate restraint that caused marks but no external medical treat-ment / consultation required - Repeated incidents / patterns of similar Repeated incidents / patterns of similar incident not caused by a Person in Position of Trust (PIPoT)	Incidents at this level must be reported to the Safeguarding addust Team within the council, where a decision whether to progress the concern to a S42 enquiry will be made. You may need to contact the police / emergency services. Examples: - Unexplained significant injuries - Intended harm towards an adult with care and support need there is ongoing distress for harm or whee there is ongoing distress of the support needs, where injuries have been sustained or emotional distress caused - Inappropriate restraint that requires medical treatment or excludes element rather than deliberate where there was a reckless element rather than deliberate vindent caused by a Person in Position of Trust (PPOT)					
EVERY STAGE - Review of care plans - Risk management planning		- Raise a safeguarding concert - Safeguarding plan - Care Act Assessment - Cap pointment reunexplained bruising / marks - Referral to Occupational Therapy	- Raise a safeguarding concern - If there is an indication a criminal act has occurred, the police must be informed and consulted - Immediate safeguarding plans must be implemented - Follow your organisation's PIPoT policy

The enhanced safeguarding threshold document also covers concerns relating to:

- Pressure ulcers
- > Falls
- Maladministration of medication

- 1-3 Minor impact unlikely to reoccur could be addressed via agency internal process/procedures e.g. disciplinary, care management or consider referral to Safeguarding Adults Team to be made. It is not a 'given' that concerns falling into this section would be dealt with internally
- **4-6 Moderate Harm low risk or reoccurrence** Could be addressed via agency internal process/ procedures e.g. disciplinary, care management or consider referral to Safeguarding Adults Team to be made. It is not a 'given' that any concerns falling into this section would be dealt with internally.
- 8-9 Significant harm moderate risk of reoccurrence Addressed under safeguarding procedures referral to Safeguarding Adult Team
- 10-12 Very Significant harm high risk of reoccurrence Addressed under safeguarding procedures referral to Safeguarding Adult Team to be made 15-20Critical level of harm Addressed as potential criminal matter contact police and/or emergency services consider MAPPA, MARAC etc.
